

SBIRT: “Screening, Brief Intervention, and Referral to Treatment” Training for Health Professionals

Educational Goals

1. To properly identify, intervene, and refer patients to treatment for substance use disorders.
2. To promote the awareness of substance misuse and abuse and how these interfere with medications and contribute to comorbidities.
3. To educate as to how to best communicate with patients who misuse or abuse substances to affect change.
4. To equip pharmacists to incorporate SBIRT into current practice, including the training of health professions students, and to bill for services.

Learning Objectives

At the end of this activity, the pharmacist will be able to:

- Define SBIRT and understand the rationale for universal screening
- Identify medical and psychological comorbidities of substance misuse and abuse
- Identify risk factors for opioid misuse and abuse
- Determine the appropriate pre-screening and screening tools to use in different patient populations and define at-risk and dependence levels of alcohol consumption
- Distinguish substance use disorders from psychiatric comorbidities in older adults
- Describe what substance misuse and abuse look like in older adults and how it may contribute to comorbidities
- Define motivational interviewing and identify techniques to help patients change risky behaviors
- Identify resources for referral to treatment in the Lord Fairfax Health District and how to find resources in other districts
- Identify ways to bill for SBIRT services provided
